





ATTACHMENT and ATTENTION: How Relationship Impact Learning

This three-day course examines the interaction between relational attachment strategies, social skills and cognitive development. Attachment patterns influence how children interact with one another, how they pay attention to academic information and how they stay on task.

Relationships set the stage for learning; the relationship between the parent and child, and then teacher and student activates the cognitive brain circuits that facilitate learning. This workshop will emphasize the development of attuned relationship skills as a direct way to enhance mental health and well-being. This information will help teachers, therapists and parents alike to connect with and support their children, students and clients, even in complex behavioural situations.

COURSE OBJECTIVES for all 3 days:

- 1. The learner will understand how our earliest relationships build the brain architecture we use for relating lifelong.
- 2. The learner will appreciate how experiences in early attachment relationships are encoded in the neural circuitry of our brains by 12-18 months of age, entirely in implicit memory outside of awareness, and how these patterns of attachment become the "rules"/templates/schemas for relating with others, influencing our social engagement, play and learning.
- 3. The learner will develop preliminary assessment skills of attachment patterns and how they impact relational skills throughout the lifespan.

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- 4. The learner will appreciate how these early attachment experiences influence the capacity to pay attention and interact in classroom learning.
- 5. The learner will learn about face recognition, body language and be introduced to micro-expressions; being aware of how other people are truly feeling is key.
- 6. The learner will develop skills to support social engagement through the following processes of engagement: following and imitating, sabotaging and scaffolding, the sideways approach, gleaming and beaming, and serve and return.
- 7. The learner will develop strategies for supporting complex behavioural challenges in children with significant withdrawal or acting out behaviours.
